Your hauler and the County conduct 2 Large item collection events per year. These events are held on a Saturday during the fall and a Saturday during the spring. FOOD WASTE RECYCLING - SENATE BILL 1383

In 2016, Governor Brown signed SB 1383 (the "Short - Lived Climate Pollutant Reduction Strategy") into law. This mandate required that Kern County comply, and on 7/1/23, SB 1383 was implemented throughout unincorporated Metro Bakersfield.
